### **I. SITUATION OVERVIEW**

**19 July 2018**

**SYNOPSIS:**

At 3:00 AM today, the center of Tropical Storm "INDAY" was estimated based on all available data at 840 km East of Basco, Batanes (19.4°N, 129.9°E) with maximum sustained winds of 65 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 80 km/h. Moving almost stationary. Southwest Monsoon affecting Luzon.

**FORECAST WEATHER CONDITIONS:**

Ilocos Region, Cordillera Administrative Region, Bataan, Zambales, Batanes and Babuyan Group of Island will experience monsoon rains caused by Southwest Monsoon. Possible flooding and landslides due to light to moderate with occasional heavy rains.

Metro Manila and the rest of Luzon will experience occasional rains caused by Southwest Monsoon. Possible flooding and landslides due to light to moderate to at times heavy rains.

Visayas and Mindanao will experience Partly cloudy to cloudy skies with isolated rainshowers caused by Localized thunderstorms. Possible flooding and landslides due to light to moderate to at times heavy rains.

### **II. EFFECTS**

#### **A. Incidents Monitored (TAB A)**

1. A total of **eleven (11) incidents** (landslide, strong winds, collapsed structure, and coastal erosion) were monitored in Region III, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, VI, and CAR.

- d. Coordinated with MDRRMCs and partner agencies regarding preparedness actions for TD "HENRY".
- e. Emergency Operation Center is on RED Alert effective 5:00 PM, 16 July 2018.
- f. Conducted inspection of Search and Rescue equipment of the province.

### **PDRRMC Kalinga**

- a. Emergency Operation Center is on Blue Alert effective 8:00 AM, 16 July 2018.
- b. Place responders from the 503<sup>rd</sup> Infantry Brigade, Philippine Army on standby.
- c. Continues monitoring of AOR especially with threats of landslides.
- d. Continues dissemination of advisories and warning alert to take precautionary measures along the rivers Chico, Tanudan, Saltan at Pinukpuk and Balbalan, and Pasil.

### **PDRRMC Ifugao**

- a. Activated PDRRMC EOC on 16 July 2018.
- b. Prepositioned heavy equipment and rescue vehicle for possible deployment.
- c. Disseminated advisories thru social media and SMS.
- d. Alerted PDRRMC council members and volunteers to be on standby.

## **9. RDRRMC NCR**

### **Metro Manila Disaster Risk Reduction and Management (MMDRRM) Operations Center, Office of Civil Defense – NCR Operations Center**

- a. Continuously monitors and ensures dissemination of Weather Advisories, 24-hour Public Weather Forecasts, Severe Weather Bulletins, Thunderstorm Advisories, and General Flood Advisories to all MMDRRMC Member Agencies and LGUs DRRM Offices.

### **OCD – NCR**

- a. On BLUE alert status.
- b. Disseminated copies of Weather Advisory Heavy Rainfall Warning to the LDRRMCs and MMDRRMC Member Agencies.
- c. Marikina City DRRMO declared 2<sup>nd</sup> Alarm for Marikina River, pre-emptive evacuation ongoing.
- d. Valenzuela City DRRMO conducted pre-emptive evacuation in low-lying areas.
- e. Pasig City DRRMO on high alert. Engineering Groups assigned in pumping stations on alert and presently in their respective assignments.
- f. QCRRMO responded to landslide incident involving one (1) residential unit (bungalow type) at Brgy. Escopa II with no injuries reported.

### **DSWD – NCR**

- a. Daily monitoring of weather conditions and other emergencies through telephone, internet, cell phone, etc. by the Disaster Response Management Division Staff and Quick Response Team Leaders.
- b. Quick Response Teams of FO-NCR composed of organic staff from the Field Office and Centers and Residential Care Facilities (C/RCFs) are on standby alert and will be activated and mobilized in response to any eventualities.
- c. As of 17 July 2018, 10 evacuation centers are open. Two (2) of these ECs are pre-emptive only. Of these open ECs, five (5) are in Marikina City: Two (2) are pre-emptive ECs; four (4) are in Quezon City; and one (1) is in Malabon City.
- d. FO-NCR is continuously coordinating with the 17 LGUs thru its respective Local Social Welfare and Development Office (LSWDOs) regarding necessary augmentation assistance needed by the affected families.



**DOH – NCR**

- a. Prepositioning of Teams that necessitates response.
- b. Distributed Doxycycline prophylaxis to the flooded municipalities.
- c. Disseminated IEC materials.

**CDRRMC Malabon**

- a. EOC is continuously monitoring AOR.
- b. Emergency Response Team on standby.
- c. Prepositioned assets and ready for distribution.
- d. Assets are prepositioned and ready for distribution.
- e. Provided “Libreng Sakay” bound to Bayan-Letre, Concepcion Monumento.

**CDRRMC Mandaluyong**

- a. Continuous monitoring of situation

**CDRRMC Marikina**

- a. Continuously monitoring of Marikina River.
- b. Pre-positioned emergency response equipment
- c. Conducted pre-emptive evacuation due to 2<sup>nd</sup> alarm level of Marikina River.

**CDRRMC Navotas**

- a. Monitors AOR.
- b. Standby resources.

**CDRRMC Parañaque**

- a. LDRRMC is continuously monitoring the weather disturbance.
- b. LDRRMC is advised to be on alert and monitor the progression of the weather disturbance.

**CDRRMC Makati**

- a. Deployed City Buses at Chino Roces, PRC, and Mantrade to help stranded motorists.

**CDRRMC Quezon**

- a. Continuously monitoring AOR.
- b. Emergency Response Equipment on standby.

**CDRRMC Valenzuela**

- a. Continuously monitoring the progress of Southwest Monsoon enhanced by TD “HENRY”.
- b. Prepositioned response and relief assets.
- c. Prepared all evacuation center to cater evacuees.
- d. Assisted evacuees to evacuation center.
- e. Rescue personnel and equipment prepositioned in flood-prone areas.
- f. Continuous flood level monitoring.
- g. Continuous monitoring of dam and Tullahan River.
- h. Alerted high-risk areas for flooding.
- i. Rescue personnel and equipment prepositioned in flood-prone areas.
- j. Conducted pre-emptive evacuation in low-lying areas.
