I. SITUATION OVERVIEW:

- "KARDING" has maintained its strength and remained almost stationary over the Philippine Sea.
- "KARDING" is not expected to make landfall in any part of the country.
- The Tropical Depression and the LPA over the West Philippine Sea (OUTSIDE PAR) may enhance the Southwest Monsoon, which would bring scattered to widespread moderate to heavy rains over the western sections of Northern and Central Luzon starting Friday (10 August).
- Sea travel remains risky over the western seaboard of Central and Southern Luzon.


Location of eye/center:	At 10:00 PM today , the center of Tropical Depression "KARDING" was estimated based on all available data 1,160 km East of Calayan, Cagayan (19.2°N, 132.5°E) .
Strength:	Maximum sustained winds of 55 kph near the center and gustiness of up to 65 kph
Forecast Movement:	Almost stationary
